The second important event will undoubtedly be the 192<sup>nd</sup> session of the Executive Board (24 September to 11 October 2013), including the meeting of the Committee on Non-Governmental partners (NGP), which will be held on **Thursday 26 September** and for which you will soon receive the detailed programme.

You have also recently received the invitation from the Director-General to the 37<sup>th</sup> Session of the General Conference of UNESCO, to be held from 5 to 20 November 2013. The orientation seminar we organize for NGOs in collaboration with the Liaison Committee on **Wednesday 25 September** will provide you with all relevant information regarding the functioning and major challenges of the General Conference, as well as on the modalities of participation for NGOs. # 22-25 October 2013 – 8th Annual Internet Governance Forum Meeting (IGF), Bali, Indonesia

# 29 October 2013 - Award Ceremony of the 2013 UNESCO/Juan Bosch Prize for the Promotion of Social Science Research in Latin America and the Caribbean

This Prize rewards young researchers who contribute to reinforcing the links between social sciences research and public policies. It also seeks to motivate young researchers and encourage intellectual exchange and dialogue in Latin America and the Caribbean. The prize is named after the eminent author, politician, social analyst and fervent advocate of democratic values and a culture of peace, whose work made a remarkable contribution to the study of social and political processes in the Dominican Republic and the Caribbean.

The prize will officially award its young laureate, Karen Nathalia Cerón Steeven, during a ceremony that will take place on the sidelines of the 8th UNESCO Youth Forum. Selected by an international jury, the young Latin-American researcher was designated as the 1<sup>st</sup> laureate of this prize at the end of 2012 in recognition of her essay addressing youth violence in Central America.

Established in 2009 by UNESCO's Executive Board, the UNESCO/Juan Bosch Prize consists of US\$10,000 and a diploma awarded every two years.
