- Owner terminology changed to Vice-Chair with an identified Deputy Vice-Chair to be more
 consistent with terminology used in other WFEO standing committees. All Vice-Chairs and
 Deputy Vice-Chairs have accepted the responsibilities of the position.

- In 2016, themes vice-chairs will submit a quarterly report to the WiE Secretary (Stacey DelVecchio) who will submit a compiled theme report to the WiE committee. This will ensure progress on the themes happens throughout the year. Due dates of quarter reports are below.

Marlene Kanga advised the committee that she is a member of the UNESCO STEM and Gender Advancement (SAGA) Advisory Committee, representing Australia. The purpose of this project is to improve statistical indicators for women's participation in science, engineering and technology. Marlene will advise the CWIE when there is a need to disseminate or test specific outcomes. Ms. Note that their measures are on STEM and the WiE Theme 3 would be specifically on engineering.

 - Women's role in modern society
