(YEFL will be interested in working with HKIE YE on the future programs</li> <li>- <b>Australia (Nicole Brown)</b> – Chair of the YE for Engineers Australia. Instituted a group focused on a national perspective with age, gender, sectoral diversity. 3 working groups operational – Local Support, External Relations, Research &amp; Development teams. 2 monthly training/presentations to develop soft skills and technical expertise respectively. 450% increase in participation/uptake.</li> <li>- <b>South Africa (Michael Mhlanga)</b> – SAICE YMP – Engineering Quiz night, won the WED poster competition, collaboration with the MEC of the Department of Infrastructure, involved the WED hackathon, Climate action engagements. 2022 YMP committee including YMP in Diaspora to capture a multinational and regional oversight. Future events: After action review of remarkable engineering projects (e.g., World Cup Stadium) for YMP learning, Online shows, DEI events, Women in STEM, Climate Action, Future Custodians Webinars Series etc.</li> <li>- <b>Myanmar (Aung Thet Ping)</b> – Limited activities due to the political situation. Mostly virtual activities including regional and multinational webinars (e.g., with HKIE). Developed a YE app to enable more opportunities for collaboration among YEs.
